Definitions

- “Number of Students Who Began the Program” means the number of students who began a program who were scheduled to complete the program within 100% of the published program length within the reporting calendar year and excludes all students who cancelled during the cancellation period.
- “Students Available for Graduation” is the number of students who began the program minus the number of students who have died, been incarcerated, or been called to active military duty.
- “Number of On-time Graduates” is the number of students who completed the program within 100% of the published program length within the reporting calendar year.
- “On-time Completion Rate” is the number of on-time graduates divided by the number of students available for graduation.
- “150% Graduates” is the number of students who completed the program within 150% of the program length (includes on-time graduates).
- “150% Completion Rate” is the number of students who completed the program in the reported calendar year within 150% of the published program length, including on-time graduates, divided by the number of students available for graduation.
- “Graduates Available for Employment” means the number of graduates minus the number of graduates unavailable for employment.
- “Graduates Unavailable for Employment” means the graduates who, after graduation, die, become incarcerated, are called to active military duty, are international students that leave the United States or do not have a visa allowing employment in the United States, or are continuing their education in an accredited or bureau-approved postsecondary institution.
- “Graduates Employed in the Field” means graduates who beginning within six months after a student completes the applicable educational program are gainfully employed, whose employment has been reported, and for whom the institution has documented verification of employment. For occupations for which the state requires passing an examination, the six months period begins after the announcement of the examination results for the first examination available after a student completes an applicable educational program.
- “Placement Rate Employed in the Field” is calculated by dividing the number of graduates gainfully employed in the field by the number of graduates available for employment.
- “Number of Graduates Taking Exam” is the number of graduates who took the first available exam in the reported calendar year.
- “First Available Exam Date” is the date for the first available exam after a student completed a program.
- “Passage Rate” is calculated by dividing the number of graduates who passed the exam by the number of graduates who took the reported licensing exam.
- “Number Who Passed First Available Exam” is the number of graduates who took and passed the first available licensing exam after completing the program.
- “Salary” is as reported by graduate or graduate’s employer.
- “No Salary Information Reported” is the number of graduates for whom, after making reasonable attempts, the school was not able to obtain salary information.

STUDENT'S RIGHT TO CANCEL (from UPR Enrollment Agreement)

You have the right to cancel the agreement for a course of instruction including any equipment or other goods and services included in the agreement without penalty or obligation, until midnight of the eighth business day after the day on which you (1) received your first lesson, (2) received a copy of the Notice of Cancellation, or (3) received a copy of the enrollment agreement, whichever is later.

Cancellation shall occur when you have given written notice of cancellation to the school in any manner. If not in writing, this should be followed up with a signed confirmation to confirm your identity. The confirmation letter should be sent to the address of the School shown on the top of the front page of the enrollment agreement. You can do this by mail, hand delivery, telegram, or any other means.

The notice of cancellation is effective from the time it is given in any manner, so long as you provide a signed confirmation. The notice need not take any particular form and is effective if it shows that you no longer wish to be bound by the enrollment agreement or continue your attendance at the school.

If you cancel the enrollment agreement, you will have no liability to the School and the School will refund any money that you paid within 30 days after we receive your notice of cancellation.

You have the right to cancel the enrollment agreement and receive a full refund before the first lesson and materials are received. Cancellation is effective on the date written notice of cancellation is sent. If the University sent the first class materials before an effective cancellation notice was received, the University shall make a refund for these materials within 45 days after the student's return of the materials.
